## Jesus Cares Leader, Kathy Augustine, Receives Award!

The Care of the Soul Leadership Award provides an opportunity for The Lutheran Home Association to show appreciation to individuals and to thank God for providing faithful servants in the work of His Kingdom.

One of the recipients is our St. John's Goodhue member, Kathy Augustine.

"God is gracious. All people deserve to be reached with the message of God's grace." These words reflect Kathy Augustine's deep conviction about the importance of sharing the Gospel message, particularly with people who have special needs.

Her work with Jesus Cares Ministries (JCM) began when Pastor Dallas Miller and Pastor Carl Ziemer recruited her to work with the Red Wing Conference program 21 years ago in

Rochester, Minnesota. She became involved with this group partially because of a need she saw with her nephew, who had cerebral palsy. The group in Rochester, which her nephew attended, is still up and running and very active. Kathy also helped teach at a JCM group at Vasa Children's Home in Red Wing, Minnesota. Now Kathy and her JCM students meet two Tuesdays a month, at Jordan Towers in Red Wing. She teaches the class a Bible lesson, and four area pastors alternate holding a "Worship at the Cross" service. There is always a lot of singing, fellowship and

fun involved. Sometimes after classes the group will go out to eat at a local restaurant or celebrate a member's birthday. They also host an annual Christmas party.

The person who nominated her wrote, "It is more than evident how much the men and women that Kathy serves love her. You will always find a smile on their face as they look forward eagerly to hearing about Jesus' love. Kathy faces every situation with devotion and patience and is truly witness of our Lord's love to 'even the least of these.'"

## Voters' Meeting News—January 25, 2012

Like Elijah who

On Wednesday January 25th, congregational president, Paul Benidt called the Annual Voters' Meeting to order. The opening devotion was given by Pastor Engel and based on the Old Testament lesson from last Sunday about Elijah passing responsibility on to Elisha. He talked about the struggles and the blessings of working for the Lord. Like Elijah who went from the joy of seeing the Lord destroy the prophets of Baal, to the depths of believing that no other faithful Jews remained in Israel, sometimes churches today also experience extreme highs and lows. That point is obvious in looking at the Annual Report for 2011 and seeing low weekly attendance (about 33%) and hearing the elders report about removing delinquent members who have not participated in the congregation in any way for more than five years. However on the positive side God is very richly blessing the ministry of St. John's Lutheran School in the Christian growth of the

students and as an instrument for outreach.

Reports were given by all boards. The treasurer's annual report indicates that expenses for 2011 were \$21,009 under budget. The downside was that expenses were \$16,655 over income.

The suggestion of the Board for Adult Discipleship was to start up Lenten Suppers on February 22. Anyone willing to volunteer should sign up on the bulletin board in the church basement.

The Planned Giving Committee which oversees the Endowment Fund and the Building Trust Fund reported that our assets in the two funds increased by about \$54,000 in the last quarter of the year. According to the Annual Report, the funds stand at \$834,368.20 in the Endowment Fund, and \$114,632.10 in the Building Trust Fund.

The Board of Elders reported that 148 letters were sent out in 2010 to encourage members to return and worship with us, or

seek another WELS church in their area. 51 names of inactive members were removed from our membership because of lack of response or inability to locate.

The Board on Youth and Child Discipleship presented numbers regarding the children of our congregation ages birth through 8th grade. There are 42 children ages birth-4 yrs. There are 82 children, ages 5 through 8th grade. 40 of them are enrolled in our school. Chairman Shannon Bohme reported that 7 new families have become members through their involvement in the school including 12 adults and 13 students in the last couple of years. The Board is beginning to look at revising the tuition costs for 2012/2013.

Kevin Smith, chairman of the Board for Church Properties reported that bids are being compared for repair of the front walls of the church.

Committee Chairman Duane Leurquin reported for the Facilities Planning Committee that they are looking at three options for improving our worship and school facilities: reconstruction, new construction or purchase of an existing building. Notes from their meetings are posted on the bulletin board in the church basement.

In elections, the following men were chosen to three year terms: Mike Miller as congregational treasurer; Jerald Plitzuweit as chairman

of Adult Discipleship; and, Todd Sarnstrom as chairman of the Board of Outreach.

The Voters also approved removing 2 front pews to allow for more space for special services.

\$23, 984.49 was transferred from the Improvement Fund to the General Fund in order to balance all of the designated funds. And finally the voters approved allocating interest from the Endowment Fund, \$43,950, to be divided equally among Improvement

Fund, God's Children Fund and the General Fund.

President Benidt appointed Luke Wegner to serve as our congregational delegate during 2012 and as chairman of the 2011 Auditing Committee

A partial report of the 2010 Auditing Committee was approved. The remainder of the report is expected to be presented at the April Voters Meeting.

## Facilities Planning Committee Report

Starting in August this year the Facilities Planning Committee appointed by congregational chairman Paul Benidt has been meeting and working on a plan for facilities that will enable St. John's to conduct its Ministry in accordance with the vision of the congregation. We have met regularly, once or twice a month, and will be placing the meeting minutes on the board in the church basement for all to see what the committee is discussing and working on.

Over the months we have conducted a survey of the membership to better understand what the priorities of the congregation are. We also recommended that the Church Council

undertake an update to the vision document to bring in line with the current vision of the membership.

The current goal of the committee is that by late summer/fall of 2012 we will finish our work and make a recommendation to the Church Council and then to the Church membership with the goal of the congregation adopting the plan. The committee's plan is to recommend the place and type of facility that will allow St. John's to effectively carry out our Ministry.

Once the work of the committee is done and the direction adopted by the congregation much work will need to be done to actually work out detailed plans

and the financing of a building program. There will be opportunities and it will be necessary for all of our members to be involved in the execution of the plan in order for the plan to be successful.

The committee asks that you keep the work of the committee in your prayers so that the recommendation that comes forward is shaped by the Ministry that God has put before St. John's to carry out in the Red Wing area.

## Supper Meal for Children at Kids Count Program

### What is Kids Count?

It is a program for children aged new-born through age 18 who have been abused or have witnessed violence.

### What is the Friday night program?

Elementary aged children are picked up after school and taken to the Friendship House for supper and an activity.

### Where is the Friendship House?

It is at 480 W. 8th St. in Red Wing.

### How can I help?

The Women's Bible Study group is coordinating supper for approximately 15 children the 2nd Friday of each month. The supper needs to be dropped off at the Friendship House by 4 pm on that day. The building is open all day and there is a refrigerator in which to put the food. If the food needs to be reheated, the staff will do that.

### What are some ideas of what I could take?

- ◆ Casserole
- ◆ Bread/buns
- ◆ Beverage such as Milk or Juice
- ◆ Sandwiches
- ◆ Bag of baby carrots
- ◆ Tacos
- ◆ Fruit – fresh or canned
- ◆ Soup
- ◆ Dessert – cookies, candy, brownies

### What if I want to help, but I don't want to cook?

- ◆ Hotdogs and buns
- ◆ Frozen lasagna from the store can be baked in the oven at the House
- ◆ Frozen pizza or have pizza delivered
- ◆ Cash for McDonald's and the staff will take the group out to eat

### How much should I prepare?

Usually there are 15 children to be fed. These children are hungry

and are not picky eaters. Plan generously. If there would happen to be any leftovers, none will go to waste because the children ask to take leftovers home.

### Do I need to provide plates, cups, napkins and flatware?

Not at this time.


