Maria Reese

If you weren't sure when you were leaving or how long you'd be gone, would you be ready to go? Well, Maria Reese is ready to go to Africa. She just has to wait for the Malawian government to issue her a work permit. She hopes to be gone for at least a year, but may stay for three.

Reese will be the Coordinator for the Lutheran Mobile Clinic which works under the Central Africa Medical Mission. Her duties will include payroll, keeping the clinic within the budget, and reconcile with CAMM and other organizations connected to health care and the government. Reese is not a nurse, her job will be administrative.

Asked what prepared Reese for this work she said, "I have been preparing for this my whole life." She is curious about other cultures, interested in people, able to adapt to living conditions. She also cred-

ited her parents because they have lived their faith their whole lives and her mom (Eunice Reese) was always talking about mission work. Reese and her mom had done Vacation Bible School in the Ukraine and Reese went to teach English in the Dominican Republic.

Maria will be working with people she knows-- one of the nurses has been a friend of Maria's since high school. This friend is also the former administrator, the role Maria will assume when she gets there. She traveled to Malawi this past January and has met the rest of the staff. The clinic is independent of a church but every day the vicar will lead a devotion to all the people that are seen by the clinic. The vicar is from the Lutheran Church of Central Africa, and the devotion will be in the same building as the clinic so it will tie the spiritual well being to the physical well being.

The living conditions will include sharing a two bedroom house with her friend that is a nurse, and there are other buildings on the compound: supplies, house for the housekeeper, and there is almost always hot water but occa-

sionally there will be electrical outages, sometimes 2 hours a day. There will be internet and wireless service. She will be able to use a cell phone and there will be a land line too.

Her office will be at home, but she will help load the ambulance each day (which is a Toyota land cruiser, with 4 wheel drive, needed for the roads in the country which can be bad in rainy season), and she will run errands for the staff.

Reese is not afraid of working in another culture. The only things that concern her until she gets used to them will be driving on the other side of the road, and having to deal with foot traffic and animals that roam freely: chickens, dogs, cows, and goats. The main language of Malawi is Chichewa and she learned some of it when she was there in January. She said they have a very different way of greeting people. Say you came to a table of eight people you would go around the table and greet each one separately instead of just saying "hi everyone."

When asked how the members of St. John's can support the work of the

CAMM, her first response was, "Prayers." But she did add that for example if they were short of pill bottles, we could collect them and send them over, but the money spent on postage of such things could be put to much better use, so it is best to just send money to the CAMM office in Milwaukee because postage is so expensive. (Please don't send empty pill bottles unless you contact the office first to see if there is a need.)

## Common Questions regarding the trip to Israel

1. **Is it safe?** Yes. I was told the most dangerous part of the trip would be getting to and from the Minneapolis airport. If a situation should arise in Israel, the company will cancel the trip and refund our money.
2. **How many are going?** Right now there are 17 signed up. We are doubling with a WELS church from Thiensville, WI. They currently have 18, so we will get to travel on our own bus.
3. **Is there a minimum needed for the trip or a maximum that can sign up?** No. Whoever signs up will be going. We'll add more buses if we have to.
4. **What is the weather like in Israel?** The high temperatures in January are usually in the 50s-60s. It can be rainy.
5. **Is there a lot of walking?** I would say about 3 miles a day on average. The terrain can be hilly. This isn't the type of trip where there is a lot of sitting around by the pool.
6. **What should I wear?** Besides good walking shoes, wear your normal clothes. Bring a light jacket. Some places require modest dress, meaning your shoulders and knees covered—not a problem in January.
7. **Do I need to tip the workers?** No. Tips are included in the price of the trip. The company will give generous tips to the workers who help us.
8. **Do I need to exchange money?** You can, but don't have to. Most places take American dollars. You can easily find honest people to exchange money if you would like. Many places also accept American credit cards. Be sure to call your credit card company to inform them that you will be traveling out of the country.
9. **How's the food?** Good, and healthier than American food! (Salad for breakfast, anyone?) You may want a few snacks for the bus.
10. **Will you be leading this trip again?** No. This is it for Israel. Someday I would like to see Germany, though.
11. **When is the latest I can sign up?** I wouldn't recommend trying to squeeze in after October. Obtaining the necessary visas before the trip is the main issue. The travel company does this for us.
12. **Is anyone going on the extension trip to Rome?** Yes. There are 4 of us so far.
13. **What if I forget something?** The only thing you absolutely must have is a passport. You can always buy toothpaste in Israel.
14. **Is it worth it?** Absolutely. You will never get over the feeling of standing at Calvary, the empty tomb, the Sea of Galilee and many other places where Jesus walked. It's a once-in-a-lifetime trip!

## Update Facility Planning Committee

This summer, the Facilities Planning Committee hosted two architects, two accessibility specialists, and a structural engineer for an intense day of examining our East Avenue facility. We held a meeting with these specialists in the morning to discuss project expectations and facility issues. We supplied them with copies of old photographs, clippings from the archives, a timeline of facility upgrades from 1918 to the present, materials from our previous space planning efforts with Station 19, notes from research that we conducted at the Goodhue County Historical Society, and electronic links to reference documents pertaining to heritage preservation in the Red Wing community. The specialists toured our basement, sanctuary, school, and grounds. They asked questions, took notes,

climbed the steeple, peered around every corner and into every nook. The architects came again the following day to measure the building for floor plans. They returned once more to inspect the roof and gutter systems in an attempt to ferret out the source of our water problems in the sanctuary.

What happens next? Now we wait. All of our efforts and theirs will result in a Historic Structure Report for our facility, due in late September. We expect this report to assess the condition of the buildings, including their structural soundness, note our current accommodation efforts and make suggestions to increase accessibility, recommend plans of action for facility improvements, and outline the costs of potential upgrades. We will also obtain accurate floor

plans.

Once this process is complete, the Facilities Planning Committee will resume regular meetings. We will review the Historic Structure Report and study all of the options presented, including our prospects at the Spring Creek property and the former Hancock School. We will compare costs, review congregational priorities, and recommend a plan of action. We do not expect to come up with a single solution that answers all of our facility issues. However, having thoroughly examined our challenges and our opportunities, we hope to make a recommendation that will meet many of our ministry needs. The Facilities Planning Committee asks for your continued support and prayers as we work on your behalf.
