ChristLight This Week

After Pentecost, Jesus' disciples confess Him boldly in their words and actions. Two examples of this are found in Acts 3 and 4.

The Healing of the Lame Man - One day as Peter and John were coming to the temple, they saw a lame man begging at the gate. Rather than giving him money as expected, Peter healed the surprised man in the name of Jesus. This man became a powerful witness to God as he went running and jumping through the temple praising God. The excitement caused by this gave Peter the opportunity to preach to a crowd of people about Jesus.

Peter and John are Arrested - The healing of this man disturbed the chief priests and rulers of the people. They felt that they must stop this "Jesus Movement" before it went any farther. They put Peter and John in jail overnight and then warned them never to speak of Jesus again. Peter and John used this as a chance to tell their captors about Jesus. They conclude by saying, "We cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard."

We today need to pray to God and ask Him for both the opportunity and the courage to speak about His Word. The more we talk to others about God and His Word, the more comfortable we will feel doing so.

- ◆ Joey Engel, Aiden Roper, and Mackenzie Nelson completed a Memory Treasure sheet.

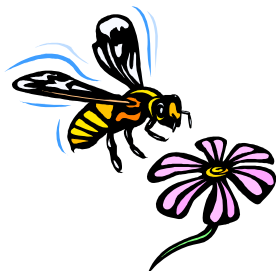
Our Hive is A-Buzzing!
